DO'S & DON'TS



DO understand our line crews are dispatched as soon as there is one report of an outage. When they arrive, they will assess the situation and get to work on correcting the issue. Often, customer service representatives will not have an estimated time of restoration because the line crews are busy working to resolve the problem and will only send updates once the outage is restored.



DO be patient if you try to reach us by phone and cannot get through. During outages, we experience very high call volume and we will take your call as soon as we can.



DO give detailed information when you call to report outages. Give the representative your address or account number. If your electricity is out and you see a downed line, make sure to let the representative know and do not approach the line.



DON'T try to cut trees or limbs off of a fallen power line. If you see a downed line, stay away from it.



DON'T report power outages to Facebook. It is not tied to our outage reporting system.
